The weather was ideal for the 2025 Helly Hansen Women's Challenge. The first race saw *Black Swan* sailed by Catherine and Gigi round the top mark just ahead of Sophie and Ros in *Woody*. Anna and Roslyn in *Ralph Newman* followed closely behind, then Jessie and Alyse in *Vin*, Jackie and Jeannie in *Eli D* then led in Lisa and Kerry in *Dolly Wallis*, and *Alex Martin* sailed by Jenny and Petra.

In the second race the light breeze meant that sailing was very close. *Black Swan* finished ahead of a tight group of *Vin, Dolly Wallis Woody* and *Ralph Newman* all with seconds of each other followed by *Alex Martin* and *Eli D*.

With a little more breeze, in the third race *Black Swan* led for most of the race from the start, until cheering from the starters boat convinced them that they had finished, when, in fact, there were two more legs to sail. This allowed the fleet to catch up and for *Woody* to sneak ahead, followed by *Vin*, then *Black Swan*, *Dolly Wallis*, *Ralph Newman*, *Alex Martin* and finally *Eli D*.

Following a welcome lunch on the dock, Catherine and Gigi were awarded first place overall, with Sophia and Ros second and Jessie and Alyse third and presented with prizes generously provided by Helly Hansen.











April Highlights Hansa World Championships 2025

The Hansa World Championships have just been held at Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club in Newport and Manly Sailability has been heavily involved, with a total of seven boats being chartered by overseas competitors. More significantly, one of our longest serving volunteers, Michael Burnett, was an entrant in the 303 Solo division in *Ralph Newman*.

With over 200 entrants from 19 nations around the world this was a major international regatta and Michael did us proud, finishing 73rd overall, 18th in the Australian Championship and 6th in the NSW Championship. Congratulations Michael on a fine performance.

One of the chartered boats was our little Hansa 2.3 *Clea* which was sailed by Giuseppe Olmeti from Bologna in Italy. After achieving first place in the first race, Giuseppe finished fourth overall in the Hansa 2.3 division, which shows that although *Clea* is our oldest boat she can still provide spirited and competitive sailing

Australia Day Regatta winners

Recently the winners of the various Australia Day Regattas were invited to Sydney Town Hall to receive their medals, which were presented by Deputy Lord Mayor Dan Maxwell.

This is the oldest continual sailing regatta in the world, having been conducted since 1837.
