A Paralympian in the Family

We were excited to learn that Paralympic swimmer, Holly Warn, is the granddaughter of one our volunteers, Michael Morgan.

15 year-old Holly was Australia's youngest athlete at the Paris Paralympics and her journey there has been marked by determination and resilience. Born with cerebral palsy, doctors warned she might never walk or talk, but Holly defied the odds and began swimming at just a few months old.

She first gained attention as the youngest swimmer to trial for the Paralympics at age 12. Although she didn't make the Tokyo 2020 Games, she continued to train and compete at national levels. In 2023, she was selected for the Para Flippers Development Squad and competed in the Para Swimming European Open Championships.

At the 2024 Paris Paralympics, Holly competed in three events, and placed 7th in the 400m freestyle. With her eyes set on future Paralympic Games in Los Angeles 2028 and Brisbane 2032, Holly Warn is undoubtedly a name to watch, and we know that Michael is a very proud Grandpa indeed.



Hansa World Championships Coming to Sydney

The 2025 Hansa Class World Championships will be held in Sydney at Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club, from March 23rd-30th 2025. The Hansa class is the type of boat we use at Sailability, with race classes for the Hansa 2.3, 303 singles and doubles, Liberty and SKUD 18.

The Championships will be a fantastic opportunity to showcase Australian talent, meet other sailors from around the world and experience the thrill of competition.

AED Training

Over two dates this month, volunteers were trained in how to use the nearby AED in the event of a cardiac emergency. While the device is designed to talk any non-medically trained user through the process, being familiar with what to do could save precious time in an emergency.

Our resident Training Officer, John Weaver, talked us through how to perform chest compressions and how (a second person) should set up the AED, using a special training version of the device, kindly loaned to us by Marine Rescue. While we hope we never have to use it, it's better to be prepared.
