- 2. Self Inflatable life-jacket gas checks.
- 3. Tidying of storage cupboards.
- 4. Reversal of changes to jib sheets.
- 5. Tidying up and checking of First Aid Kit.
- 6. Hospitality cupboard check and tidying.

Necessary gear was distributed to groups and we were on our way with the tasks.

It was a very busy morning, with lots of chat and good natured conversations.

James, Ella, Tarek, Craig and Alysse, quickly donned life-jackets and were ready to go.


