
Notes from the Editor

We covered rigging, a practical (dry) demonstration of sail trim and race tactics on the dock, before putting those skills into practice on the water. Mini-Bus Parking Permits Extended

For volunteers and participants traveling by car or mini-bus, we have street parking permits available to be loaned to you on the day of your visit, if you expect to exceed the parking time limit. While the mini-bus permits expired at the end of August, the council has extended these until the 30th September while they get the new ones issued. Therefore if you are using a mini-bus permit with an expiry date of August, you can disregard that date, and will not receive an infringement notice. Note that car permits are already valid to the end of September.

If you require a parking permit, please ask at the registration table – usually overseen by Helen – and be sure to return it when you leave so we can loan it to someone else.
