Notes from the Editor



Sailing back to the dock after one of last year's regattas, Helene's curiosity got the better of her. Spotting a line of unattended paddle boards in the middle of the water near Delwood beach, she sailed over to have a look. Suddenly Helene and her crew, Ivan, realised their centreboard had become entangled in the line tying the paddle boards together, and they were forced to untie them to free the boat. Concerned they might float away, Helene tried hard to retie the paddle boards. Some say she fell, some say she jumped, but Helene ended up in the water clinging to those paddle boards to

keep them from floating off, while Ivan sailed back to the dock to fetch help. Jim and John W soon arrived in Charlie's Chariot to retrieve Helene and secure the wayward paddle boards, and Helene earned her status as Manly Sailability's 'mermaid'.

Helene is one of our longest-serving volunteers, first starting in 2001 while she was on a temporary work placement from Europe. For an expatriate far from home, Sailability ticked all the boxes of time on the harbour, a sense of community and a means of giving back. Helene later migrated permanently to Australia, finally settling back in Sydney in 2006, and she has been involved with Sailability ever since. We'd like to think that the community she found at Manly Sailability played a part in her decision to make Sydney home, but either way, we're lucky to have this belle of the ocean.
