On the day we chat by phone Michael has just rushed from showing school kids around State Parliament, and is lined up to talk to a minister next. His new gig is very different, he tells me. He has had to get up to speed quickly on how to get things done, whom to work with, and the due diligence that the heightened level of scrutiny around lawmaking demands. On the flip side, no longer racing around the whole of the Northern Beaches from Manly to Palm Beach has allowed him a little more time to spend with his family and friends. But it's clear that one thing that hasn't changed is Michael's commitment to serving the community. An Independent since long before the 'Teal wave', Michael's focus has

always been on getting people the best deal possible, and working with, not against, those in power to get things done.
