Sailing Reports



Wednesday, 9 December 2020 - A Truly Fabulous Wednesday

Something was in the air again! Almost blown away by the last few days of strong winds, Sailability Manly surfaced again on a perfect sailing day, along with our wonderful Wednesday team of volunteers.

Denis, Helen, Ken, Rob, Ragnhild and Luke arrived bright and early to put seven boats out because we were expecting five to six people with a disability, as well as 22 volunteers, some who needed a bit more training before certified as competent. One by one, the others walked in, until our full complement was there. John W, Eli, Caroline, Wilma, Warwick, Heather, Jennie, Michael, Corey, Jim, Ivan, John B, Peter, and Helene took their places either in the Hansas, on Charlie's Chariot or on the pontoon. Charlie's Chariot, which had been not quite securely enough tied to the deck, took off on a journey of his own before being spotted by the eagle eyes of Ken and Warwick. Ken and Rob hopped into a rigged Hansa and caught him before he rammed any of the moored boats, to be quickly motored back to the pontoon.

Slowly, our participant sailors arrived for their sail. Jack took off with Rob in Vin and had a very leisurely sail around Manly Cove. Monique arrived next with Natalia, then the Sargood crew, and Ken, under the watchful eye of Jake, who took off with Jim looking like a masked ranger in Black Swan. Later, Ben also had a sail with Jim.

Rob brought Jack back for a ride in Charlie's Chariot and swapped sailors to Limor. Limor's son, Shalev also had a sail close to Mum, but with great speed and lots of leaning over the side. Kel arrived with Harrison and Harrison's twin brother, James. James is learning to sail so that he will be able to take Harrison for a sail sometime in the future, and Harrison's priorities are to sit comfortably in the boats and enjoy the ride. Anthea, (otherwise known as MUM) and her oldest son, Rex, took off in Charlie's Chariot so that they could watch this spectacle. The whole family took advantage of this beautiful day and sailing experience.

Today certainly got the vote of the best days sailing this year, even beating those warm November days! Everything was packed away in cooperation of everyone and some had fun wetting each other under the hose, while spraying down the boats. Special thanks to Helen and Wilma, who coped with collecting all of those signatures and contact details, passing out masks and then sanitising our used equipment. And of

course a big hats off to Corey, who expertly managed the radio and recorded the times of boats that were out and about in Manly Cove.

Meet the Committee

Alan Bimson - Sailability Manly Webmaster



Sailability Manly Volunteer of the Year Award Recipient

Please meet Alan Bimson, a valued Volunteer, Committee Member and our Webmaster for Sailability Manly. Alan has just celebrated a milestone birthday, turning 70 on December 15. We are very fortunate at Sailability Manly to benefit from Alan's vast computer expertise! As a special treat, Alan agreed to be interviewed for the December 2020 *Signals* Newsletter. Please read on to learn more about his fascinating life.

Delivered in 1950 at Royal North Shore Hospital in St. Leonard's NSW, Alan became disabled only a few minutes after birth with Cerebral Palsy. When asked about challenges he has faced, he humbly replied, "Name me one human on this planet who has never had challenges? They all accumulate to make us who we are. I fear a life without them!" Alan has enjoyed living in the beautiful Northern Beaches, residing in both Narrabeen and Frenchs Forest over the years. He went to school from 1954 to 1966 at the

Spastic Centre Queen St. in Mosman. His impressive array of subjects studied include Tech ED., Radio Trades/Electronics, Data Processing, Supervision Management, Programming in "C", COBOL, UNIX, Machine Code and HTML. He also earned an IT Certificate and an Associate Diploma in IT and Business Management.

Alan grew up involved with the Spastic Centre, which is now the Cerebral Palsy Alliance (CPA). He also has experience serving on many community living/housing boards. In his spare time, he was involved with a community disability radio program at Macquarie University called, "Wheeling Free." Over the span of six years, he worked there in various capacities such as reporter, panel operator, producer and director.

Alan heard about Sailability from his Hydro Physiotherapist (repeatedly) until he finally decided to book a tryout in August 2008. On that first go when sailing out past the Skiff Club, Alan turned to his Skipper and said, "Okay, how do I sign up?" He was hooked! Only just two years later, Alan had competently learned to sail solo. When asked what he has gained from sailing he answered, "The ability to relax and Zen out; I'm a solo person and being out there on my own, with the lapping water and breeze – it's GREAT!" He became a member of Sailability Manly on his first day and was recruited to join the Committee only six months later. Alan took on the Webmaster role at that time and also serves as a Sailability NSW representative and Consulting NSW Webmaster.

Throughout his years of membership and service to Sailability Manly, Alan has been recognised with two awards. He received the Volunteer of the Year Award (pictured above) for development of Training Videos he edited and produced with Judy Cole, and he earned the Most Improved Sailor of the Year Award. Alan also once came in first place, winning the 2.3 class at the Dobroyd Sailability Regatta. When asked how volunteering has impacted him, he answered, "Since I've been retired, volunteering keeps my brain active." Alan's other hobbies include electronics, music (mainly instrumentals) from 45 to 90's, researching the Internet and collecting models of cars he has previously owned.

Alan is truly an inspiration to us all! His closing message to Sailability members: "Be true to yourselves."
