February: A Time for Awareness by Heather Mackay

February is widely celebrated around the world as "the month of love" with Valentine's Day falling on the 14th, right smack in the middle. However, another special day in February deserves our attention as well. Did you know that beginning in 2004, the 18th of February has been recognised as **International Asperger's Awareness Day**? The aim is to highlight the challenges of people and their families who are coping with this high functioning form of Autism. This often misunderstood syndrome can manifest itself in a variety of forms, and affected families inevitably must adjust routines and many other aspects of daily life, plus seek help to manage. As we go to print, the equally significant **International Wheelchair Day** (1 March) just past, which has three noteworthy aims:

- 1) Enabling wheelchair users to celebrate the positive impact a wheelchair has in their lives;

I miss going to Sailability and seeing you all.


I'm in Mona Vale Hospital Rehabilitation Unit. I want you to know that I want to be back there soon. I'm learning to drive a wheelchair.
